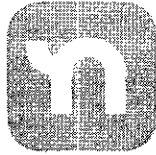


YOUR DRIVERS LICENSES WITH ANOTHER PERSON'S PHOTO

Longmont Police are seeing an increased number of scams associated with fraudulent driver's licenses. These fraud cases are generally connected to rental fraud and the sale of vehicles.

All of the driver's licenses we have seen look like authentic licenses. However, they are not. The person named on the driver's license exists but is not the photographed person on the license being presented. The physical description typically matches the photographed person providing the fraudulent license, and the photo is the person committing the fraud.

Tips:

- If money is being exchanged in the transaction requiring a driver's license, require the driver's license be provided in person. In most instances, the presentation of the license has not been done in person, and the driver's license has been text messaged or emailed. Ask for alternate photo IDs while the license is being presented in person.
- If there is any question about the validity of a driver's license, please contact Longmont Police in person. Be prepared to provide all associated paperwork when inquiring. Longmont Public Safety Lobby hours are Monday – Friday, 7 am to 6 pm, 225 Kimbark.
